

# **JANUARY PRESENTATION**

**Microsoft Teams Meeting** 

12:00-1:30 PM

**TOPIC:** : Climate Change:

What is it? How Will it Impact the Built Environment?

"Climate Change" will be a new chapter in the 2021 ASHRAE Fundamentals Handbook. Attendees will hear an overview of the latest and projected environmental transformations due to climate change, how it is affecting (and will affect) Michigan, and its projected impact on the built environment industry. Attendees are alerted to the fact that design practices as well as standards related to energy, water use and IAQ can be expected to change due to global warming and more frequent and violent weather events. We will hear all about it from two local ASHRAE Life Member engineers who contributed to the writing of the new Climate Change Chapter and who are both trained presenters for the 'Energy Standard', ANSI/ASHRAE/IESNA Std. 90.1.

# **SPEAKERS**



Janice K. Means, P.E., LEED AP, FESD

Consulting Engineer Professor Emerita Lawrence Technological University Southfield, Michigan

Janice has worked in, taught and promoted solar energy and sustainability since the 1970's. She has served on the Boards of the Detroit ASHRAE Chapter (as Past President), the Michigan Solar Energy Association, and the Michigan Interfaith Power and Light (MIIPL).

Means is a Registered Professional Engineer and holds a Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Michigan-Dearborn, a BA in Secondary Education Social Science (Physics Minor) and a BS in General Engineering, both from Oakland University.

She is a Past Chair of the ASHRAE Technical Committee (TC) on Solar and Other Renewable Energies and serves on several other committees at the international level. She is co-author of the Climate Change Chapter to be published in the 2021 ASHRAE Fundamentals Handbook, and ASHRAE's 2019 Energy Guideline for Historic Buildings. She was co-editor of the 4th and 5th Editions of the ASHRAE GreenGuide—Design, Construction, and Operation of Sustainable Buildings and has presented internationally on energy-related and high-performance building topics.

Means has received numerous ASHRAE and Engineering Society of Detroit (ESD) awards, is an ESD Fellow, and was most recently honored with the 2020 E.K. Campbell Award of Merit for Outstanding Service and Achievement in Teaching at ASHRAE's Annual Meeting in Orlando, Florida in February.

In retirement from teaching, she continues to be available to consult and speak on building sustainability topics—especially for historic buildings—and to promote women and minorities entering STEM fields.



James L. (Jim) Newman, CEM, LEED AP BD+C, ASHRAE OPMP & BEAP, FESD, FASHRAE

Managing Partner Newman Consulting Group, LLC Farmington Hills, Michigan

Jim has been an ASHRAE Distinguished Lecturer since 2010, and was awarded an ASHRAE Distinguished Service Award in 2012, and again in 2013. He was a writer of ASHRAE's 2008 Energy Position Document, is a Past Vice-Chair of the Technical Committee (TC) on Industrial Air Conditioning, and is a corresponding member of several TCs. He has specialized in energy conservation and indoor air quality since the oil embargo of the '70s.

He is active in USGBC, BOMA, AIA Committee on the Environment (COTE), and the ULI Commercial Real Estate and Technology Committee. He is Past Chair of the Detroit BOMA Chapter's Committee on Sustainability, a trainer for the BOMA High Performing Building Certification, and a Fellow of the Engineering Society of Detroit (ESD) and a Fellow of ASHRAE.

Jim speaks about Green and Sustainable topics on radio and TV, and gives seminars world-wide to both technical and non-technical organizations on these and other topics related to the construction industry. He has received awards from numerous organizations and has been published in many magazines and technical journals.

He received a BSME from Tufts University, Boston, MA, and continued his education toward an MBA degree at the University of Detroit and Wayne State University.



# Notes from December's Meeting.

What a great presentation! We also had a good amount of attendance at 35 attendees. We had one attendee call it "the best of all the webinars" they've attended this year. There is tons of info there – so please reach out if you want the PDFs of the presentation and also I recommend watching the recording from the link above. A couple of items that came out of the meeting that I thought were worth specifically highlighting:

- NFPA 13 is meant to guide us in the layout and installation of fire sprinkler systems, it also encompasses the INITIAL testing of the systems. Once a sprinkler system is installed, all the required testing and maintenance is found in NFPA 25. Something I think we all forget from time to time.
- When do you need an alarm check riser versus a shotgun riser? I know I have heard this questions few times before. Karl explains that the alarm check riser is seen a lot less in construction now as it is more expensive than the shotgun, but in areas where you need a MECHANICAL means of sending the alarm signal (something required by some jurisdictions, mostly overseas) versus an electric means – you have to go with the alarm check.
