**TOPIC:** IPC Code Changes 2015/2018/2021

Codes are vital for ensuring that systems will operate safely to protect the health of the users, as well as the environment, by providing standard methods of design and construction that are enforceable by Code Officials. One of the functions of ASPE is to regularly review the model Plumbing codes and propose modifications and updates to keep the codes current and applicable with industry changes and innovations. In this session we will review

the upcoming changes in both the 2018 IPC and the 2021 IPC and explore some of the rationale behind why these changes are being made.

Presenter: William A. Grayzar, CPD, GPD - Mr. Grayzar is a past president of the Eastern Michigan Chapter of ASPE and currently serves as the chapters V.P. Legislative. He has over 35 years of experience in architecture and engineering. Employed with DiClemente Siegel Design Inc. for over 20 years, Bill continues to enhance his system engineering skills through additional vocational field training. Bill has an excellent working knowledge of Michigan's current building codes and regulations. Bill holds an Associate's Degree of Architectural Technology from Delta College and certifications in Plumbing Design and Green Plumbing Design from ASPE. Bill is active with the National Society of ASPE serving on numerous committees. Bill also serves as the current President of the Code Study and Development Group of Southeast Michigan and is a member of National Fire Protection Association. Bill received the Michigan Chapter of ASSE award as Engineer of the Year in 2013.



#### **VP Legislative Report**

William Grayzar, CPD



Deadline for the 2024 International Codes is fast approaching:

The deadline to submit code changes to the 2024 International Code – Group "A" Codes is January 11, 2021. The Group "A" Codes include; the International Building Code – Egress (IBC-E) (Chapters 10 and 11), International Building Code – Fire

Safety (IBC-FS) (Chapters 7, 8, 9 partial, 14 and 16), International Building Code – General (IBC-G) (Chapters 3, 4, 5, 6, 12, 13, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33), International Fire Code (IFC), International Fuel Gas Code (IFGC), International Mechanical Code (IMC), International Plumbing Code (IPC), International Property maintenance Code (IPMC), International Private Sewage Disposal Code (IPSDC), International Residential Code-Mechanical (IRC-M) (Chapters 12 through 23), International Residential Code – Plumbing (IRC-P) (Chapters 25 through 33), International Swimming Pool & Spa Code (ISPSC), International Wildland -Urban Interface Code (IWUIC) and the International Zoning Code (IZC).

Proposed code changes will be posted the International Code Council website (iccsafe.org) on March 1, 2021. Committee Action Hearings (CAH) will be held April 11-21, 2021 at the Riverside Convention Center in Rochester NY. Public Comment Hearings (PCH) will be held September 22 through 29, 2021 at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center in Pittsburgh, PA. I intend to be present at these hearings.

The Eastern Michigan Chapter of ASPE (EMC-ASPE), the National Society of ASPE and the Code Study Development Group of Southeastern Michigan (CSDGSM) will also be represented at the Code hearings. These organizations will also be preparing and reviewing proposed code changes over the course of the next few months, prior to the hearings and the January 11, 2021 deadline.

If you are aware of an area in the code that requires an update or modification, please feel free to reach out to me or any of the organizations listed above. The National Society of ASPE also has resources to help with preparing a proposed code change and if the National Society agrees with the proposed update or modification, they may even choose to support the proposed code change. You can check out the National Society of ASPE website (aspe.org) of contact any of the EMC-ASPE board members for more information on preparing a code change.

#### **VP Technical Report**

Hello from your VP Tech!

I hope you were able to join us for our first meeting. Although it was virtual — we had 2 fantastic presentations! We will be attempting to host in-person/hybrid meetings this year, but it all depends on the Governor's Orders and CDC Guidelines. Please always check your email and our website for the most up to

We hope you can all be patient with us as we try to provide multiple options for our members to attend our meetings. One of ASPE's greatest benefits is the lasting connections and camaraderie we develop, so we all sincerely hope to be able to meet in person this next Program Year, at some point.

We will offer to send all EMC members copies of the presentations in pdf format, and we are planning on recording all our meetings and posting them...somewhere, for your access if you are unable to make the meetings. Stay tuned!

Now, for those that missed September's meeting, Bill Grayzar kicked us off with a very in-depth, but student friendly presentation on "Plumbing 101 – Pipe Sizing." Bill gave us an

overview of what plumbing is, types of plumbing systems and then went into domestic water systems: fixtures and piping. Finally, he ended with domestic water system sizing; touching on pressure requirements and how to properly estimate building demand load (according to current codes). One great point that Bill brought up was how in the Michigan Plumbing Code, an ASSE 1070 mixing valve is required on each hand washing fixture; so you can't use one valve to serve multiple fixtures, even though those products are available. Thank you, Bill! And we look forward to your presentation next month!

Our second speaker of the evening was Dan Cole, Senior Director of Technical Services of IAPMO. He spoke to us on Hunter's Curve and how IAPMO is helping bring the traditional method of estimating water demand into the 21st Century. I imagine by now you have all heard/seen how the water fixture unit method leads to grossly oversized piping, due to the age when Hunter developed his curves and how fixture water volume rates have changed since then. Dan took us into a relatively shallow dive into the statistics and math behind it all! I can't possibly recant all of Dan's presentation here, but some main points I took away were:

- WSFU (water supply fixture units) and DFUs (drainage fixture units) are different! Hunter started with DFUs, which actually correlate to cubic feet per minute of flow rate from a fixture, on a scale of 1 to 6 with (1) DFU being approximately 7.5gpm fixture flow rate.
- In 1940, Hunter started on WSFUs and binomial distribution.
  - When coming up with these numbers, Hunter assumed a congested use of the fixtures; but he didn't have actual end use data and "congested" was meant to be when there is a line for the restroom so fixtures are almost constantly in use. So very applicable for Stadiums...but not very applicable for Office or Residential applications.
- In 1994, Robert Wistort developed an algorithm for 'Zone C' type buildings which are large buildings, that calculated flow at the 99th percentile and gave a good approximation to calculate the demand for fixtures directly, vs Hunter's Curves.
- There is also a Modified Wistort Method (zero-truncated binomial distribution) for Residential End Uses in Zone B classification, which is geared more toward medium size buildings/multi-family dwellings. This is a great way to get more real life demand numbers but does assume residential end use, uncongested use of fixtures (no line) and efficient fixtures.
  - o In one example, hunter's Curve would yield a demand of 120 gpm, Wistort's original equation would yield 120 gpm, but the Modified Wistort's equation yields a demand of 12.4 gpm! 12.4 vs 120! Big difference!

- Zone A classified use is more for a single family home. And IAPMO has developed a water demand calculator for these type of buildings that has used the Modified Wistort's and exhaustive enumeration to yield far more accurate demand numbers than the old Hunter's Curve fixture unit method. https://www.iapmo.org/water-demand-calculator/
- In this new demand calculator for an example building, the calculator showed a demand of 15 gpm, the old code methods would give you anywhere from 40 gm to 80 gpm! Actual measured data showed a demand of 11 gpm- so their calculator really works and more accurately predicts peak demand flow! Imagine how this could change you water heater sizing, booster pump sizing, pipe sizing! But hold on...the calculator is only applicable for residential uses. Refer to the IAPMO site for more information.
- Obviously, the next question we all wanted to know is: so, when will there be a calculator for other end uses? Commercial? Well, there isn't data available yet. NIST does have a grant to start gathering data but a timeline for when we could expect another calculator is TBD.
- But for now, if you have a residential project check out the calculator.
   Most codes, even the MPC, do have a section allowing for an engineered
   design method to be used for sizing. You should get approval from
   your AHJ- and if you are working in a UPC territory, this calculator is
   approved.

Another fun fact I learned from our September meeting was that approximately ½ of Michigan buildings are serve by wells! I know my house is on a well, and we have a new school we are designing that will be on well water – but I didn't think it was that common here!
